

Overview of Covered Programs

- <u>CDBG Funds</u> can be used in a flexible manner for economic development, improvements to parks and open space, needed public services, and affordable housing projects and programs.
- <u>HOME Investment Partnership Funds</u> can be used to further affordable housing programs and projects.
- Emergency Solutions Grant (ESG) Funds are to be used to support shelters, homelessness prevention, and rapid re-housing programs for homeless and those at risk of homelessness



Action Plan: Goals and Objectives

- <u>Stabilize and Revitalize Diverse Neighborhoods</u> this objective includes neighborhood infrastructure, parks and open space, and economic development projects aimed at targeted low to moderate-income areas within the city.
- <u>Preserve and Maintain Existing Affordable Housing –</u> this objective includes both CDBG and HOME funding for targeting affordable housing activities including homeowner rehab, energy system replacement, homebuyer assistance, tenant-based rental assistance, and special projects.
- <u>Family Stabilization and Job Readiness</u> this objective mainly supports public services agencies in providing family economic stabilization activities mainly through CDBG funding.
- <u>Ending and Reducing Homelessness</u> this objective will utilize mainly ESG funds to target efforts to reduce and end homelessness.
- <u>Infrastructure and Urban Environment Improvements</u> this objective utilizes CDBG funds to address a lack of recreational space in low and moderate-income areas in the city. Other improvements include mobility/safety improvements and tree planting. q







ASSESSMENT OF GOALS & OBJECTIVES ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT

Covid Business Relief Loans

- Spring 2020: City awarded supplemental CDBG-CV allocation as part of CARES Act legislative package.
- As pandemic and related interruptions persisted longer than expected the city allocated over \$1.7M in direct business relief through forgivable loan program.
- In program year 2021, CDBG-funded business relief program started to assist with the closures.
- The city continued to provide funding through targeted city-funded program focused on outdoor dining.

Overall, the city assisted approximately 200 businesses

Main Street Technical Assistance

- Throughout the pandemic the city relied heavily on two local on-the-ground technical assistance agencies to help small businesses navigate the ever-changing landscapes of public health policies and city mandates.
- In program year 2021, Union Square and East Somerville Main Streets continued to provide technical assistance and community outreach to small businesses in their districts with limited capacity to navigate through the public health crisis.
- Also provided technical assistance for businesses struggling with the impacts of the rapid development in those business districts.

Multi-Modal Traffic and Road Improvements

The city completed multi-modal and pedestrian safety goals.

Bike lane safety measures such as purchase and installation of bike lane separators were implemented in low-tomoderate income areas citywide.

Partially financed utilizing CDBG funds.

STREET TREE PLANTING

Planted approx. 145 trees throughout CDBG districts across Spring and Fall 2021; increased urban tree canopy to improve quality of life. Costs also included watering of trees planted in CDBG-eligible areas during the previous program year.

2020 had 201 trees planted, with 60 in CDBG-eligible areas)

HEALEY SCHOOL PLAYGROUND AND FIELDS

Phase 2 of athletic fields began construction in late Spring 2021 and continued throughout the program year. The project will provide much needed athletic field and recreational space for youth programming.

JUNCTION PARK

The City's newest CDBG-funded parks project entered the design and planning phase during the past program year. Pending design decisions, construction expected to begin in Spring/Summer of 2023

- Throughout the 2021-2022 year, one of the City's goals was to create more affordable housing and continue to aid in upgrades and rehabilitation of housing across the city. 23 of the units were eligible for CDBG funding.
- Eligible uses of this funding includes window replacements, boiler, and water heater replacement efficiency upgrades. Some units were also purchased in order to maintain their affordability in the future.





Public Services Expenditures CDBG




2021-2022 CAPER
